The cost of these workshops will be met from the school budget.

Proposal for Federation of Marsh Hill Nursery School and Perry Beeches Nursery School Under One Head Teacher and One Governing Board

Since September 2019, Marsh Hill Nursery School and Perry Beeches Nursery School have been working closely together with one Head Teacher; sharing good practice, making cost savings and with the two Governing Boards working closely together to enable this to continue.

The opportunity to consider Federation has resulted from our concerns with regards to the sustainability of the two Nursery Schools. This is a national concern for Maintained Nursery Schools, some of which have recently had to close or are facing closure. The Governing Boards have both voted to undertake consultation with regard to federation.

Attached to this newsletter is a document which sets out our proposal and what federation would mean for our children, parents, staff and the local community. It forms part of a six-week consultation process, during which we are seeking the views of everyone who has an interest in the school. It includes a response form for you to complete and return.

At the end of the consultation period, the Governing Boards of the two schools will make a final decision on whether to federate, taking into account everyone's views and comments.
